IPR Cell, Directorate of Research, Dr Y S Parmar University of Horticulture& Forestry, Nauni - Solan organised in collaboration with State Council for Science Technology and Environment (HP), a one day awareness workshop on Intellectual Property Rights on 30.03.2017 at the University Campus. This awareness workshop on Intellectual Property Rights was an outcome of the meeting held in October, 2016 in State Council of Science Technology and Environment (HP), Shimla to establish IPR cells in the educational institutions in the state. As such, the University organised the workshop for the benefit of scientists and research scholars, keeping in tune with the objective laid down in National IP Policy 2016 notified on 12.05.2016 especially Objective I - IPR Awareness: Outreach and Promotion. It is timely and befitting keeping in view that in the current year, the theme of WIPO Day, 2017 is INNOVATION:

IMPROVING LIVES through agriculture which falls on forthcoming 26th April.

In all, there were 80 participants comprising senior officers, faculty, research scholars and postgraduate students. The registered participants were from across the disciplines working at the main Campus in various Departments.

At the outset, the Organising Secretary of the Workshop welcomed the Chief Guest, Dr K. S. Verma, Director of Research, Dr Y S Parmar University of Horticulture& Forestry, Nauni-Solan, other dignitaries and the participants. Thereafter Nodal/Patenting officer, IPR Cell of the University briefly introduced about the workshop and the activities undertaken by IPR Cell of the University.

While delivering keynote address, the Chief Guest, Dr K S Verma, Director of Research stressed the need to identify patentable technology and to reorient research efforts in the light of intellectual property regime. He emphasized on technology driven intellectual property.

The programme lectures covered overall scenario, general introduction to Intellectual Property, its various instruments / tools, patents, copyrights, GIs, trademarks, plant variety protection related Acts and procedures for *DUS* testing and registration of plant varieties. The scientist expert from SCST&E (HP), Ms Ritika Kanwar highlighted the patent activities of H P Patent Information Center (HPPIC) and also spoke on application filing and procedures for the grant of Patents.

Dr K Kumar, Nodal Officer, IPR Cell delivered a talk on Global Scenario of Intellectual Property Rights with relevance to agriculture, the emphasis laid down was mainly on protection and management of IP innovations in agriculture sector including horticulture and forestry. He stressed that in the era of competitiveness and in the light WTO/GATT/TRIPS, it becomes all the more worthwhile to accustom ourselves with global trends and needs to develop strong mechanisms to protect our IP. The know-how on IP regime in vogue, assumes greater significance and relevance in the era of globalization and competition. More so, India is embarking upon digitization and through skill and innovation is to realize **CREATIVE INDIA:**INNOVATIVE INDIA. Dr Dinesh Singh Thakur, Principal Scientist, Dept. of Fruit Science delivered a lecture on Plant Variety Protection and PPV&Fr Act, 2001. The participants were made aware of *DUS* testing and plant variety registration procedures in India. Useful deliberations followed in the plenary session, chaired by Director of Research.
